

# Policies and Standards

## *Provide One Aspect of Control*

- State Standards include:
  1. Appropriate use for non-state issued devices.  
(SS-12-002.01 - Non-State Technology and Computing Devices)
    - Each agency will need to determine the standards and controls they will allow and support for mobility devices and information access.
    - Special considerations need to be provided for:
      - Federal Requirements
      - Controls for lost or stolen devices
      - Records Management, Retention, e-Discovery
    - **NOTE: Laws are relatively new and untested in court**

# Policies and Standards

## *Provide One Aspect of Control*

- State Standards include:
  2. No expectation of privacy with non-state devices when accessing state information.
    - (SS-12-001.01 – Privacy in the Workplace)
      - State workers using non-state issued devices with access to state data are subject to monitoring and inspection in order to protect state information assets.
