Dr. Curtis A. Carver Jr.

Curtis A. Carver Jr., Ph.D., is the vice chancellor and chief information officer for the Board of Regents of University System of Georgia (USG). In this capacity, he oversees a statewide educational infrastructure and service organization with more than 190 innovators and more than \$75 million annual investment in higher education. He also provides technical oversight of the USG Shared Services Center.

With a unique mix of industry and academic experiences, Dr. Carver has led the transformation of IT services by partnering with USG business owners, institutions, and other state agencies to jointly solve problems. The introduction of private cloud services, entrepreneurial offerings, portfolio management, a new data system, social media, unified communications, strategic partner engagement, and a focused and aligned financial model has been well received in Georgia and around the nation. He is the recipient of numerous academic, military, and technology awards in a career spanning nearly three decades. Dr. Carver was recognized at the 2012 Global CIO Summit as a recipient of the prestigious Top 10 Break Away Leader Award for his transformational leadership.



Tino Mantella

Tino Mantella joined TAG in September 2004 as the organization's new president. At TAG, Mr. Mantella has worked with a team of dedicated volunteers and staff to build a prestigious board made up of 60 technology stakeholders, grow membership by more than 500%, and add a series of programs and services that support TAG's vision of educating, informing and uniting the technology community.
